<b>PROJECT DESCRIPTION</b>	The funding for this project will be used for the outreach and recruitment of PWD from the local community college and will include the following services: assessment of transferable skills; assessment of supportive needs; labor market research; job development and work readiness skills; resumes; interviewing; etc. The WBL activities will include: work experience; transitional jobs; OJT; pre-apprenticeship; and apprenticeship. The AJCC staff, DSS staff and other agencies will assure completion of WBL activities, job attainment and job retention.
